## Zoller art exhibit

An invitational exhibition of

Neopunkedelic and Psychotronic art will be on display in Zoller Gallery at University Park Aug. 21 until Sept. 30.

The exhibition, titled "No Neo," is curated by James Goldsworthy, associate professor of art at Edinboro University of Pennsylvania, and Richard F. Dennis of Hook Gallery in Brooklyn, N.Y.

"No Neo" features a group of 25 artists from around the country who work outside the Blue-chip commercial galleries. Rising from the Punk art movement, the Neopunkedelic and Psychotronic movement retains the Punk art fondness for bold technique, color and its concern for direct human expression but modifies those techniques to include a more personal choice of themes, subjects and iconography.

Works in painting, drawing, photography, printmaking, installation art, sculpture and neon will be exhibited.

Zoller Gallery is located in 101 Visual Arts Building. Gallery hours are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday; 11 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Saturday, and noon to 4 p.m. Sunday.
